

CRISIS CARE PROGRAM

A program that supports patients and their pets.



Sometimes patients are admitted to hospital and do not have family or friends to care for their pet. Most times the pet is the patients significant other.

Our Crisis Care Program places their pet into foster care where the pet receives love and reassurance during this difficult time.

Our Crisis Car Program can improve patient outcomes by alleviating the patients anxiety, improving compliance in care and treatment and less potential for discharge against medical advice.

This program is of no cost to the patient, prevents shelter surrender and promotes the human-animal bond.



Adelaide Pets Alive have secured a formal agreement with CALHN (Central Adelaide Local Health Network to operate the Care Crisis Program. This is huge achievement for us as we have only been operating since March! OFFICIAL




